

Recap of Last 9/6/15 Meeting

Opening/Formation:

We started with our opening prayer, followed with an opening reflection by Veronica O'Donnell who read selections from St. Theresa d'Avila and St. Francis de Sales. Thereafter, grace was said before our meal/social time. At 2 o'clock, just prior to on-going formation, we watched a recruitment video brought to Clari Claus' attention by Victoria Spalding of Mt. St. Sepulcher fraternity. Bob Calderon began the formation discussion by asking, "Who is Jesus to us?" Members shared their perceptions of Jesus. Bob then broke us up into groups of 3-4 persons to discuss chapter three of our on-going formation book <u>Catching Fire Becoming Flame</u>. Bob passed out a slip of paper to each group labeled "Question 1." It contained the following text:

"How are we living out the purgative practices of community, prayer, and repentance in our daily lives right now? Which of the three needs greatest attention? Is it easier for us as secular Franciscans, and if yes or no, why?" After discussing the above questions in our individual groups, a representative was selected from each group to present the group's points of view. The majority of the groups felt that "community" needed the

greatest attention, because it is so fluid and subject to change. Community includes work, family, church, friends, fraternity members, neighbors, etc. Gail noted that as Franciscans, we have a tool box of ways to confront problems and seek solutions

Presentation:
