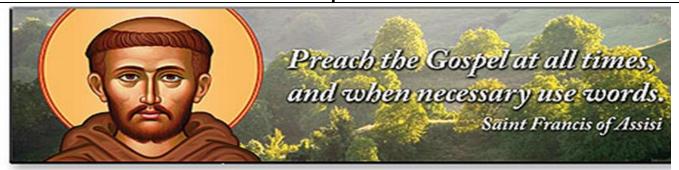

## Recap of Last 10/4/15 Meeting

#### **Opening/Formation:**

Bob Calderon, Vice Minister, led the discussion of Chapter 8, "The Attitude of Gratitude" Principles of Prayer" from our on-going Formation book <u>Catching Fire Becoming Flame</u>. Bob told us he would like to begin the discussion talking about attitude. He continued by saying that it is good to have a good attitude in the workplace. For example, he offered that those employees who don't possess a good attitude either are not employed long, or they promoted out of the office. People who display good attitudes and are affable attract people to them in a favorable way. Vicky Shanholtz injected that her former employer Trader Joe's would screen people and only hire those who exhibited the quality of caring for others or demonstrated an ability to bring out the good in other people. Gil Donahue remarked that attitude and altitude fit together and that it is good for a person to both raise his or her attitude and allow other people to be raised by another person, so that each person feels good about

oneself. Bill Richey commented that one's regular disposition can often be due to genetics. Some people are negative by nature; others are cheerful. The cheerful people should not look down on the negative person. Bob continued by stating that being grateful makes people happy. Force yourself to smile, because it will make you happier. When you care about other people, it naturally puts you in a better mood. Gail Dowling shared that she enjoys following Examen, and recommended people to look back on their day and identify the things that you are thankful for. Your attitude will change and you will become grateful. Bob noted that you need to be humble to be grateful. Bob offered two key saying quoted in our On-going Formation book. The French say that "gratitude is the memory of the heart." Meister Eckhardt, a 14<sup>th</sup> century Dominican mystic said, "If the only prayer you ever say in your entire life is 'thank you,' it will be enough." For April, Bob assigned chapter 9 and asked that we go into the Albertofm.org website and view the videos.

#### **Presentation**

Clari Claus – *Stations of the Cross:* Clari's presentation consisted of having everyone participate in the Stations of the Cross for Lent, using readings from a pamphlet and pictures of the stations which she distributed to members for reading or holding up for meditation. Clari had also set up an elaborate, symbolic table layout to enhance everyone's experience for this event.
