Recap of Last Meeting 2/5/17

The meeting began with an opening prayer by Gail Dowling, OFS. Walter Gawlak, OFS led our on-going formation by providing a few remarks about formation. He said that we are formed by prayers; serving each other; and sharing experiences, joys, and sorrows. Walter suggested that when we finish the chapter on The Lord's Prayer in our formation book "Catching Fire, Becoming Flame," we take a break from the book and talk about prayer. He then transitioned into a recap of the ongoing formation topic from Chapter 17 of the formation book "Praying the Stations of the Cross". He asked members to discuss in small groups their experience with praying the stations. After the discussion, Walter continued with Chapter 18 "The Lord's Prayer Anew," highlighting how we could pray it slowly, meditating on the words. reviewing the purpose of the on-going formation - to support everyone's charism and strengthen our individual as well as our group-commitment via daily conversion.

Following Ongoing Formation, John Ata, OFS gave a presentation about the Polish Saint Albert Chmielowski. St. Albert was a Third Order Franciscan, and he took part in an uprising to unify Poland. During the uprising, he lost his leg and offered up his dismemberment for the unification of Poland. St. Albert a painter; he painted the famous work "Ecce Homo" (Behold the Man). He gave up painting and dedicated himself to helping the poor. It was then that he became a Franciscan. He begged for alms to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless in Krakow. St. Albert died on Christmas day in the shelter that he had set up. June 17th is his Feast Day.
