

RECAP OF MAY 5 GATHERING

PRESENTATION

Lisa Jaeger, OFS, provided a Power Point presentation, "Camino de Santiago de Compostela." This is a network of pilgrims' paths leading to the shrine of St. James the Greater at the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galacia, northwestern Spain.

- St. James was the brother of St. John the Evangelist the "sons of thunder" and sons of Zebedee
- The Apostle James was first to leave Jerusalem to spread news of the resurrection to all nations
- Holy Mary appeared to him in his discouragement the first Marian apparition, and the only one while she was alive and promised a memorial built would not be destroyed (Zaragoza, Spain)
- He returned to Jerusalem (40-41 AD); he was the first Apostle to be martyred, and was beheaded on order of Herod Agrippa (44 AD)
- Disciples returned to Spain with his body, which was interred in Galacia
- The Christian hermit Pelagius saw stars over a deserted mountain (813 AD); St. James' tomb discovered
- Cathedral of Santiago was constructed from 1075-1211
- Routes begin in ten official countries; pilgrims can also begin the journey in unofficial countries
- Heber Garcia, OFS, Bob Calderone, OFS, and Walter Gawlak, OFS, have traveled routes in Spain/ Portugal

ONGOING FORMATION

Bill Richey, OFS, highlighted May as the month of Blessed Mary and ed a group discussion on his previously shared handout highlighting our Mother in her role as Intercessor/Advocate and St. Francis's devotion to and imitation of her:

The Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order - Article 9

The Virgin Mary, humble servant of the Lord, was open to his every word and call. She was embraced by Francis with indescribable love and declared the protectress and advocate of his family. The Secular Franciscans should express their ardent love for her by imitating her complete self-giving and by praying earnestly and confidently.

From the Prologue of The Rule of the OFS

...We are spouses, when by the Holy Spirit the faithful soul is united with our Lord Jesus Christ; we are brothers to him when we fulfill "the will of the Father who is in heaven" (Mt 12:50). We are mothers, when we carry him in our heart and body (cf. 1 Corinthians 6:20) through divine love and a pure and sincere conscience; we give birth to him through a holy life which must give life to others by example (cf. Mt 5:16).

TAU ROSARY APOSTOLATE

Sally White, OFS, says, "Congratulations to all of you who gathered, made, purchased, and donated rosaries for the rosary apostolate. You provided over 250 rosaries! On Sunday, May 4, the St. Joseph Church Hispanic community — along with members of the Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, the Legion of Mary, and the Prayer Cenacle — led a Marian Procession from the center of the Town of Herndon to St. Joseph's Church. Our Lady was crowned with roses and honored on a float with hundreds of roses. During the procession, your donated rosaries were used by all the people in the procession. Remaining rosaries were donated to the Legion of Mary."



TAU ESL CLASSES APOSTOLATE

Sally White, OFS, reports that Tau volunteers for the English classes at the First Baptist Church of Herndon continue to teach and make improvements in the program. The volunteer teachers from the First Baptist Church and Tau Fraternity met to evaluate the program.

As a result they made several decisions:

- Because students often look to their teachers for help, the teachers were reminded that when students
 request for assistance for issues outside of the English classes such as requests for legal assistance,
 housing, employment, and etc. these should be referred to the Fairfax County Assistance page. All
 students received this list of places to obtain such assistance when they registered for class.
- In order to help students with registration fees, several options are now available. If a student needs to
 repeat a level, they can register for that level at a reduced registration fee. If a student advances to the
 next level of classes and has not written in their textbook, they can exchange their book for the textbook
 of their new level and register at a reduced fee.
- In order to improve proper placement of students in classes, the teachers are reviewing a new pre-testing template for the Fall semester.
- Classes are held at night and entry by unauthorized people has occurred. A decision to increase building security measures was referred to and accepted by the First Baptist Church.
- To help students retain their knowledge over the summer, Bill Bouffard, OFS, will hold a summer session from June 4 to July 30. The students will practice their reading and pronunciation skills using the book *Treasure Island*.

Registration dates for the Fall semester are September 10 and 11, 2024. The start date for classes is September 17, 2024. The final day of classes is December 17, 2024.






