RECAP OF JUNE 2 GATHERING

PRESENTATION

Sharon Goldberg, OFS, and Heber Garcia, OFS, offered a presentation based on the book, *The Grace in Aging: Awaken as You Grow Older* by Kathleen Dowling Singh (available in our Tau library collection). Some highlights:

- · Development of a spirituality of wisdom requires a deliberate and intentional effort.
- · It's crucial to have a contemplative practice to allow the God-given Divinity to rise from the unconscious, which supports becoming a true elder rather than only getting older.
- · Singh invites readers to look at their habitual self/ego-oriented programs.
- · Our primitive, reptilian brain dominates our reception of information. It houses our survival instinct (fight, flight, or freeze response).
- · Many studies have confirmed that humanity carries a negativity bias; our first instinct is to be safe. This was also noted by Fr. Bernie Tickerhoof, TOR, at the annual retreat last month.
- · The Enneagram is one tool available to help us understand the motivations, core beliefs, and unconscious patterns that drive our behavior. Many books are available on this subject, including from Fr. Bernie as well as Fr. Richard Rohr, OFM.
- · Bloom where you're planted to nurture your spirituality.
- · The book, *The Gift of Years: Growing Old Gracefully* by Joan Chittister, OSB, was referenced.
- · Our life path is our choice. Practice presence; withdraw from ego using silence and talking to our Lord in solitude. Ask Him for guidance.
- · Group discussion followed the presentation.

ONGOING FORMATION

Bill Richey, OFS, led a group discussion on reflections from the Tau Annual Retreat at Priest Field last month.

- · Bill thanked Joe Boyle, OFS, for all his work in planning the retreat, and Kimberley Heatherington, OFS, for taking notes she made available to all brothers and sisters.
- · General reflection themes from the group included finding Fr. Bernie's discussion on prayer most valuable, along with the concept of presence and the history included in his presentations.



Blood of Christ, Eucharistic drink and refreshment of souls, save us.




