Brothers and Sisters,

As the Easter season unfolds, we celebrate not only Christ's victory over the tomb, but His rising within each of us. The Resurrection is not just a past event — it is a present and ongoing call to awaken.

This awakening is not a one-time occurrence. Like those who encountered the Risen Lord — Mary Magdalene mistaking Him for the gardener, Thomas needing to touch His wounds — we too often fail to recognize resurrection when it stands right before us. 

RECAP OF APRIL 6 GATHERING

PRESENTATION

Jen Raimo, Candidate, offered a presentation on the Spiritual State of the Union after providing a handout via an April 6 e-mail, as well as hard copies during the gathering.

- The topic came to Jen's attention while attending law school.
- Churches were full after 9/11/01 terrorist attack.
- Religion is Jen's way of life; therefore, she became active on this front after the Obama Administration tried to change "Freedom of Religion" to "Freedom of Worship".
- The 2016 election highlighted polarized platforms.
- Concerning Luigi Mangione, suspect in the December 4, 2024, murder of Brian Thompson, CEO of UnitedHealthcare in NYC:
 - Jen heard radio reports: The GOP wants to kill him; the DNC wants to date him
 - GoFundMe has raised nearly one million dollars for his defense

RECAP OF APRIL 6 GATHERING

ONGOING FORMATION

Bill Richey, OFS, began his presentation with our viewing Fr. Chris' homily for the 5th Sunday in Lent from the section "The Gospel Through a Franciscan Lens" on secular franciscanusa.org.

Bill offered a few reflections on Fr. Chris' earlier Lenten homilies.

For the 1st Sunday in Lent, it was notable that Fr. Chris concluded with a passage from the Prologue to our OFS Rule, that we are spouses, brothers, and mothers to Jesus.

For the 2nd Sunday the various images of light from the Transfiguration illuminate Article 17 of our Rule, that we are to "respect all creatures, animate and inanimate, which 'bear the imprint of the Most High."

The 4th Sunday Parable of the Prodigal Son evoked a lively discussion about fathers and sons, sibling rivalry, inheritance conflicts, and how Francis might have felt about this parable, given his break with his father.




