FRANCISCAN SERVANT LEADERSHIP

A Call To All To Be Servant Leaders

Professed members have accepted to live a “Gospel life,” following the example of our founder St. Francis, and also inspired by the example of St. Clare. Candidates in initial formation have taken the first step in this process. As a result, we fraternity members all participate in a family of Franciscan followers. As we recognize in our own individual families, there are various jobs that need to be done: shopping for groceries, preparing and serving meals, cleaning up afterwards, running errands, etc. We can appreciate, therefore, there are similar needs in our fraternity.

Having elected a new council in September, fraternity members can recognize and appreciate the specific tasks our fellow fraternity members have accepted. We are thankful to have been able to fill all council positions. However, the council cannot by itself do everything that needs to be done to ensure the fraternity continues to flourish. All fraternity members can pitch in.

You will notice that our newsletter names the various committees that work on the fraternity’s behalf in our own and the wider community. These committees are an important assist to the council. Committee leads provide depth to our programs. Currently, there are several vacancies for our committee chairs: Cultural Diversity, Recruitment and JPIC. These are all vital elements of the fraternity’s overall program and they should be filled by those who have the interest and drive to take them on.

We are all busy with family and work matters, of course. However, we want our fraternity to continue to be vibrant and lively, all the better to attract new members, and to play an active role in the wider community. Therefore, I ask every one to prayerfully consider responding to this call and take on one of these responsibilities.

I am especially concerned to have the JPIC (Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation) position filled. Our regional JPIC Animator Pat Boye has an active agenda for 2026 and our fraternity should play a leading role in those initiatives. I held this position at the regional and fraternity level for several years. Many of us expect that Pope Leo XIV will continue Pope Francis’ emphasis on these areas of social justice; we anticipate a new encyclical in 2026.

Therefore, we should prepare ourselves to move ahead on these important social issues. Finally, all Secular Franciscans are expected to be servant leaders — to each other, as well as in our secular circles of family, friends, work, and the parish. Let’s come forward and reactivate these committee positions for the benefit of the fraternity, and to spur our own individual spiritual growth. Please pray on this. Thanks and Peace to all.
